An Introduction to our Village

Much of the village dates from around 1800. However, there are a number of older buildings and Great Oxendon is even mentioned in the Domesday Book.

The village was the starting point for the Royalist forces in their final battle of the English Civil war at Naseby just down the road and there is



an interesting trail. There are many lovely walks around the area.

The Oxendon Tunnels are disused railway tunnels. The Northampton to Market Harborough line, designed by George Stephenson, opened in 1859 and had tunnels at

Oxendon and nearby at Kelmarsh.

The former `up` line tunnel at Oxendon is open as part of the Brampton Valley Way, a linear park which runs from Boughton level crossing on the outskirts of Northampton to Little Bowden near Market Harborough, on the former railway track. It is now part of the National Cycle Network and is well used by both cyclists and walkers.



On your Doorstep



The village is situated amidst beautiful rolling countryside with stunning views. Two miles north is the attractive town of Market Harborough with an excellent selection of supermarkets and shops, there are also a number of hotels, restaurants and pubs to suit everyone's taste and budget. Culturally, there is a thriving theatre presenting plays by its own and visiting companies, it also acts as a cinema and screens theatre, opera and ballet broadcasts. The Symington Building houses a museum and a library. For the more active there is the local leisure centre with pools, gym and exercise classes, there is also a tennis club situated at Great Bowden which has use of indoor courts at the leisure centre during the winter months. Other sporting opportunities include bowls, golf, rugby, football, cricket, squash, hockey, running and athletics clubs. Within easy distance there are numerous villages and beauty spots with the opportunity for walking and cycling including Foxton Locks and Pitsford Reservoir. You may even pay a visit to a local gin distillery at Harrington. For convenience, there are several local enterprises in the village and details of these can be found on pages 6 & 7.

Kelmarsh Hall is on our doorstep and worth a visit to view the house and gardens and enjoy the many events that are held there throughout the year.

Village Life



There are numerous community events held in the village, organised by the Parochial Church Council (PCC), The Village Hall Committee, GO Social and the Youth Club. St Helen's Church



The Church dates from 13th and 14th Century and stands on the outskirts of the village. The Church is part of the Faxton Group of Churches, which consists of seven churches in villages in the area.

St Helen's has one or two services a month attended by those living in the village and others from local villages. There are additional special services during the year. SCHOOLS



Clipston Endowed Primary
School, Clipston, is the local
primary school which is two miles
away, there is a school bus to
collect the students. There are
several other primary schools in
Market Harborough, as well as a
number of nursery schools.

For secondary school students the village is in the catchment area for Guilsborough School, a co-educational academy school in Guilsborough, Northamptonshire. School buses travel from Great Oxendon to Clipston and Guilsborough. There are also a number of independent schools located in Market Harborough and neighbouring towns/villages.

Getting around



The village is well served by the road network with the main A508 running from Northampton to Market Harborough passing through its centre and a regular bus service to Market Harborough, Leicester and Northampton. A few miles south is the A14, providing links to the M1,M6 to the west and A1, M11 to the east.

Train - There is an excellent train service from Market Harborough to St. Pancras London and the North, travelling to London in journey time of one hour.
